## Occupation:

Military Service: Member of Captain Parker's company Apl. 19,1775, also member of detachment of the company called to Cambridge 10 May and 17 Jun. 1775. In 1779 John Chandler, Jr. Joseph Loring, and Burdoo entered the marine service under Commodore Tucker, and being on the southern coast, they were included in the capitulation of Charleston, S.C., by Gen. Lincoln, in 1780, and were confined as prisoners of war until their exchange. They endured severe suffering from confinement and want of provisions, and after they were exchanged, Chandler and Loring, without money, and almost without clothing, wended their way as best they could to their native home, depending on the charity of people, and they reached Lexington in a destitute and wretched condition, after an absence of about a year. After the close of the war, he was actively engaged in the militia; elected captain in 1790, and promoted to major in 1796. He was one of the selectmen of Lexington in 1796, '97 and '98
